<b>Community Ed</b> Adult Basic Ed: (763) 689-6230 Early Childhood: (763) 689-6691 EC Screening: (763) 691-6693 <a href="http://www.cambridge.k12.mn.us/~comm-ed/">http://www.cambridge.k12.mn.us/~comm-ed/</a>	<p><b>Adult Basic Education:</b> Classes for anyone who wants to prepare for the GED.</p> <p><b>Early Childhood:</b> ECFE (Early Childhood Family Education): A public school program for all Minnesota families with children between the ages of birth and kindergarten entrance. There are classes that meet weekly at both Cambridge and Isanti. Class fees are based on a sliding fee scale and no family will be turned away due to inability to pay. Home visits are also available for parenting support at no cost.</p> <p><b>Preschool:</b> District 911 Preschool offers morning, afternoon &amp; late afternoon sections in Cambridge and Isanti. Scholarship money is available based on family size and income.</p> <p><b>Early Childhood Screening:</b> Every child must have an Early Childhood Screening completed before kindergarten entrance (MN State law). Screening should be done before a child's 4th birthday; there is no cost to the parent for this screening.</p> <p><b>Adult &amp; Youth Enrichment:</b> Swimming lessons, gymnastics, health &amp; fitness, driver education, and school age childcare. Partial scholarships are available to students who reside in and attend District 911 and qualify for free/reduced lunch.</p>

Advises victims and witnesses of their rights in the legal system and maintains continuous contact with them.</p>

**Child Protection:** Not a voluntary service – services provided as a result of an accepted report of child abuse/neglect. To make a report of child maltreatment call ICFS and ask for the child protection intake worker.

**Children’s Mental Health:** Assist families in addressing the needs of their children with mental health issues. Work collaboratively with families, educators, physicians, therapists, law enforcement, placement providers, and others to coordinate services. The child must meet Rule 79 criteria to be eligible for services. Families can call ICFS directly to request services. Referrals are also received by hospitals, doctor’s offices, therapists, educators, Law Enforcement, and others.

**Developmental Disabilities:** Assist families in addressing the needs of their children who may have developmental disabilities. Eligibility criteria are defined by Rule 185. Referral for services may be made by self, schools, hospitals, providers, and internal professionals.

**PSOP:** 2 or more of the following risk factors: Poverty; Domestic Violence; Substance Abuse; History of abuse/neglect; Behavioral concerns for parent or child; Homelessness. Referral to child protection from community professionals; certain screened out child protection reports referred to PSOP.

Services include Pregnancy Health Program, Assessment of Infant & Child Growth and Development, Parenting Education, Resources for Special Needs Children, Child Health Programs, WIC, Immunization Clinics, Child and Teen Health Screenings, and Breastfeeding Support. Referrals can be from self, family & friends, Health Care Staff, Social Workers, School Personnel, Clergy, and concerned individuals. Eligibility varies and fee for services varies, call for more information.

**Early Head Start/Head Start:** Program is an early childhood family preschool program designed to help families get their children ready for school, and to support family growth towards self-sufficiency. Families can contact the agency directly and referrals by professionals are accepted. To qualify, federal income guidelines are followed. A family who is over income may apply for services, but priority is given to those who are 130% of the poverty line or lower. Other automatic qualifiers are if a family receives MFIP, SSI, is homeless, or the child is in foster care.

**Emergency Holds:** When a child is found in surroundings or conditions which endanger the child’s health or welfare or which peace officer reasonably believes will endanger the child’s health or welfare.

**Community/Shelter Advocates:** Assists in support, safety planning, filing for Order for Protections (OFP) and Harassment Restraining Orders (HRO), responds to victim after Law Enforcement intervention, and assists in filing police reports, supports through court process, and shelter for battered women and children.

**Child Advocate:** Provide crisis intervention, advocacy and support services to youth and parents residing at the shelter through resources collected by The Refuge Network. This includes parent/child/teen intakes, assessing the needs of families and assuring appropriate referrals. School-based violence prevention curriculum on bullying and Healthy/Unhealthy relationships for teens.

**Help Me Grow:** Provide specialized early childhood intervention and family support. Services are based on individual needs and may include special instruction for children and parents from early childhood teacher, OT, PT, speech, and other education professionals. Children must meet eligibility criteria. Referrals can be made by caregivers, health care providers, daycare providers, or other professionals.

**Other:**

Cambridge Medical Center, Dellwood Recovery Center, and Riverwood Centers each have a variety of counseling and evaluation services available. Qualification for services varies based on ability to pay/insurance. In addition, the County Veterans’ Services office and the Beyond the Yellow Ribbon program provide resources and services specifically for military veterans. Contact each agency as needed.
